ACTING FOR CAMERA

COURSE OVERVIEW

The Acting for Camera course is an exciting three-day intensive programme working with industry professionals.

You will learn to adapt a self-chosen monologue to work on the screen and then you will be cast by the tutors in a duologue working with a fellow course member. The course culminates in the shooting of the duologue overseen by your tutors, which will be edited by a professional editor after the course has finished. This will be delivered electronically approximately five weeks from the end of the course.

Bristol Old Vic Theatre School is equipped with state-of-the-art digital film production facilities and you will be able to experience a realistic 'on set' experience that will prepare you for life and work on a professional film set.

ACTING SUMMER FOUNDATION COURSE

COURSE OVERVIEW

This full-time ten-week foundation course is aimed at anyone over the age of 18 who is interested in improving their acting skills and abilities.

You will have the opportunity to experience at first hand, the life and culture of a world-class drama school. Entry is through audition and no qualifications are needed to apply. We are looking for students who have a love of dramatic art, an intention to play and a thirst for artistic perfection.

Students will be taught through a mixture of practical performance projects and masterclasses. You will have the opportunity to learn acting, movement, voice, dialects, singing, improvisation, stage combat and scene study techniques. A trip to a local theatre is included within the course and following this visit students will take part in a critical review of the performance.

If you have a love of acting and a commitment to learning new skills and techniques, this hands-on professional course may be for you.

SING OUT! SINGING FOR MUSICAL THEATRE

COURSE OVERVIEW

Bristol Old Vic Theatre School excels in musical theatre. With 12 finalists and two winners of the prestigious Stephen Sondheim Student Performer of the Year competition, our graduates have gone on to take up leads in the West End.

This five-day intensive course is aimed at anyone over the age of 18 who is interested in learning from leading professionals. You will experience a wide-range of repertoire and styles through group singing and solo work.

Workshops will include techniques to explore your singing voice, build a strong technique, develop your range, pitch and rhythm, as well as how to explore lyrics and acting through song. You will work with experienced practitioners to gain greater confidence in your voice, find out how nerves can enhance performance and practise top tips for auditions.

This course gives participants an unmissable chance to sing, explore and have fun!
